HAVING A HARD TIME FINDING OR MEETING A SHADCHAN?

Through *ShidduchVision's "Singles Meeting Shadchanim"* program, singles can now meet with *Shadchanim* from **all over the world**.

As the *ShidduchVision* program swings into full gear, we are pleased to announce a groundbreaking program enabling singles to meet *Shadchanim* "face-to-face", all around the globe.

Due to tremendous demand, we will be introducing "**SMS**" or "**Singles Meeting Shadchanim**," via *ShidduchVision*, beginning in mid-March, 2010. **SMS** will be available anywhere a *ShidduchVision* studio is located.

Currently, **Baltimore, MD, Chicago, IL, Lakewood, NJ, Los Angeles, CA & Toronto, Ontario** host *ShidduchVision* studios.

Shadchanim will be stationed at *ShidduchVision* studios on specific days and will have appointed times for singles in other cities to interview from another *ShidduchVision* location.
